

Arrests by Offense Category

In 2013, 94.8 percent of all Crime Index arrests were made in four of the eight Crime Index offense categories. These offenses were Larceny-Theft, 52,006 or 59.0 percent, with an arrest rate of 407.1; Aggravated Assault, 15,653 or 17.7 percent, with an arrest rate of 122.5; Burglary, 9,830 or 11.1 percent, with an arrest rate of 77.0; and Robbery, 6,122 or 6.9 percent, with an arrest rate of 47.9. The noted arrest rates are per 100,000 population.

Arrests by Age

The distribution of Crime Index arrests by broad age categories was as follows: juveniles (under 18 years of age), 12,139 or 13.8 percent; young adults (18-24 years of age), 26,180 or 29.7 percent; and adults (25 or older), 49,869 or 56.5 percent.

Juvenile Crime Index arrests decreased 10.1 percent in 2013 from the previous year's total of, 13,501, while young adult Crime Index arrests decreased 5.5 percent from the previous year's total of 27,701 and Crime Index arrests of adults increased 4.1 percent from the previous year's total of 47,909.

Juveniles accounted for substantial proportions of arrests for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Arson (34.0 percent)
- Rape (20.7 percent)
- Robbery (20.1 percent)
- Motor Vehicle Theft (16.4 percent)
- Burglary (13.5 percent)

Young adults (18-24 years of age) accounted for substantial proportions of arrests for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (46.7 percent)
- Robbery (38.7 percent)
- Motor Vehicle Theft (36.6 percent)
- Burglary (33.5 percent)
- Larceny-Theft (28.9 percent)

Adults (25 or older) accounted for substantial proportions of arrests for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Aggravated Assault (61.1 percent)
- Larceny-Theft (58.3 percent)
- Rape (55.3 percent)
- Burglary (53.1 percent)
- Murder and Nonnegligent Manslaughter (49.0 percent)

The majority of juvenile Crime Index arrests were made for the following offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (54.8 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (17.4 percent)
- Burglary (10.9 percent)

The majority of young adult Crime Index arrests were made for the following offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (57.4 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (15.2 percent)
- Burglary (12.6 percent)

The majority of adult Crime Index arrests were made for the following offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (60.8 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (19.2 percent)
- Burglary (10.5 percent)

Arrests by Sex

In 2013, 60,059 or 68.1 percent of the persons arrested for Crime Index offenses were male, a decrease of 1.3 percent from the previous year's total of 60,866. Female arrests totaled 28,129, a .4 percent decrease from the previous year's total of 28,245.

The majority of male Crime Index arrests were made for the following offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (51.1 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (19.1 percent)
- Burglary (14.3 percent)
- Robbery (8.9 percent)

The majority of female Crime Index arrests were made for the following offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (75.8 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (14.9 percent)
- Burglary (4.4 percent)
- Robbery (2.8 percent)

Arrests by Race

In 2013, 57,834 or 65.6 percent of the persons arrested for Crime Index offenses were White, 29,680 or 33.7 percent were Black, and 666 or .8 percent were Other Races.

Crime Index arrests of Whites increased .2 percent from the previous year's total of 57,702, while Crime Index arrests of Blacks decreased 3.4 percent from the previous year's total of 30,710. Crime Index arrests of Other Races decreased 4.3 percent from the previous year's total of 696.

The majority of Whites were arrested for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (64.8 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (14.4 percent)
- Burglary (12.6 percent)

The majority of Blacks were arrested for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (47.5 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (24.2 percent)
- Robbery (13.3 percent)

The majority of Other Races were arrested for the following Crime Index offenses:

- Larceny-Theft (64.4 percent)
- Aggravated Assault (18.9 percent)
- Robbery (6.0 percent)
