PENNSYLVANIA STATE POLICE
TRANSMITTED FILE REQUIREMENTS**

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1. INTRODUCTION

Pennsylvania allows jurisdictions to FTP Pennsylvania Uniform Crime Reports (PAUCR) data files. Before a jurisdiction Transmits files to the PAUCR system that jurisdiction must make a request to the PAUCR administrator to be authorized for FTP. The procedures for this request can be obtained by contacting the PAUCR administrator.

This technical document was developed to provide computer vendors with guidelines to FTP files to the PAUCR system. It is designed to establish the criteria that will serve as a reference for computer vendors.

Within the following sections/subsections the term Transmitted represents UCR data files that have been sent to the PAUCR system using the FTP protocol.

The instructions and record layouts contained in this document focus on the additional information needed when a jurisdiction Transmits a file to the PAUCR system. The “Summary Files Upload Specification” and “PA IBR File Upload Specifications” contain the instructions and record layouts for Summary and Incident-Based upload files, respectively. These documents are available at the Download area of the PAUCR web-based system. End-user information on the File Upload process is available at the Help area of the PAUCR web-based system.

Jurisdictions submitting upload files via the PAUCR web-based upload page may disregard this document.

Any computer vendor may use this document, since it is hardware and software independent.

2. PROCESS OVERVIEW

The Summary and Incident-Based processes are similar in some respects and differ in others. The Authorized Jurisdiction process takes advantage of the similarities so that minimal additional processing is required by the jurisdictions to create a Transmitted file.

Transmitted files must contain ASCII text data with the appropriate record formats as described in “Summary Files Upload Specification” and “PA IBR File Upload Specifications”. The requirements to enable a file to contain data for other jurisdictions depend upon the type of submission – Summary or Incident-Based – see “Authorized Jurisdiction Submission Specifications” for more information.

The following sections cover the topics relevant to Transmitted file submissions. These topics are “Transmitted File Preparation” and “Results Files For Transmitted Files”.

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3. TRANSMITTED FILE PREPARATION

File preparation for Transmitted submission files are covered in the following sections

3.1 SUMMARY FILE PREPARATION FOR TRANSMITTED FILES

An Upload file containing Summary data that is Transmitted to the PAUCR system must contain a Transmitting User record (see section 3.5). Currently only the Pennsylvania State Police is permitted to FTP files to the PAUCR system. Contact the UCR Administrator to determine the availability of FTP service for your agency.

3.2 INCIDENT-BASED FILE PREPARATION FOR TRANSMITTED FILES

An Upload file containing Incident-Based data that is Transmitted to the PAUCR system must contain a Transmitting User record (see section 3.5). Currently only the Pennsylvania State Police is permitted to FTP files to the PAUCR system. Contact the UCR Administrator to determine the availability of the FTP service for your agency.

3.3 INCIDENT-BASED MONTHLY SUBMISSION FOR TRANSMITTED FILES

The Complete IBR Monthly Submission record (CM) is provided to set the Juris Submission Month to a status of Complete. This will generate Summary UCR data for reporting and submission to the FBI (See section 3.5).

The Complete IBR Monthly Submission record (CM) should be sent after all Incidents and Group B Arrests, for a Juris Submission Month, have been SUCCESSFULLY submitted to the PAUCR system. This transaction will NOT work if an Incident or Group B Arrest is in an INCOMPLETE or ERROR status.

If you have SUCCESSFULLY submitted a Complete IBR Monthly Submission record (CM) and later have to Add or Modify an Incident or Group B Arrest for the Juris Submission Month, you will have to send another Complete IBR Monthly Submission record (CM) record when those transactions are SUCCESSFULLY submitted.

The Request IBR Monthly Submission Status record (RM) is provided to return the Status of the Juris Submission Month along with all Incidents and Group B Arrests for the month (See section 3.6).

3.4 UNIQUE NAME REQUIREMENT FOR TRANSMITTED FILES

When a file is uploaded using the PAUCR web-based upload page the same-named file can be uploaded successive times. This is possible because the web-based transfer logic uniquely renames each uploaded file (by adding UserId, Date, and Time to the filename) before storing it on the server. When files are Transmitted the user sending the file is responsible for uniquely naming files, within the filename standards

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specified in the aforementioned “Summary Files Upload Specification” and “PA IBR File Upload Specifications” documents.

The application used to transmit files to the PAUCR system must listen for and respond negatively when the PAUCR server sends a “File already exists...” message so that like named files are NOT over-written. Some reasons for receiving a “File already exists...” message are: 1) Multiple files with the same name Transmitted within a one minute time period; 2) The PAUCR system is down.

The PAUCR system checks the FTP \In folder approximately every minute for new files. When a new FTP file is found it is removed from the FTP \In folder and staged for processing by the PAUCR system. Once the file is removed from the FTP \In folder you are free to FTP another file with the same file name.

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3.5 TRANSMITTING USER RECORD

The PAUCR system uses the Transmitting User record to associate the file with an authorized system user. This record must be the first record in the file that is Transmitted to the PAUCR system. Section 3.5.1 details the format for the Transmitting User record and section 3.5.2 has an example of a Transmitting User record.

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3.6 COMPLETE IBR MONTHLY SUBMISSION RECORD

The PAUCR system uses the Complete IBR Monthly Submission record to set a Juris Submission Month to a status of Complete. This record must immediately follow the Transmitting User record (TU) in the file that is Transmitted to the PAUCR system. Multiple Complete IBR Monthly Submission records (CM) for a single Jurisdiction may be included in a transmitted file. If a Complete IBR Monthly Submission records (CM) is included in a transmitted file no other record type, with the exception of a Transmitting User record (TU), may be included in the transmitted file. Section 3.6.1 details the format for the Complete IBR Monthly Submission record and section 3.6.2 has an example of a Transmitting User record.

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3.7 REQUEST IBR MONTHLY SUBMISSION STATUS RECORD

The PAUCR system uses the Request IBR Monthly Submission Status record to return a list of Incidents, Group B Arrests and associated Status for the selected month, year and jurisdiction. This record must immediately follow the Transmitting User record (TU) in the file that is Transmitted to the PAUCR system. Multiple Request IBR Monthly Submission Status records (RM) for a single Jurisdiction may be included in a transmitted file. If a Request IBR Monthly Submission Status records (RM) is included in a transmitted file no other record type, with the exception of a Transmitting User record (TU), may be included in the transmitted file. Section 3.7.1 details the format for the Transmitting User record and section 3.7.2 has an example of a Transmitting User record.

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3.8 DETAILED EXAMPLES OF TRANSMITTED FILES

The following subsections contain examples of correctly formatted and sequenced records for Transmitted files. The examples cover basic submissions intended to demonstrate the proper placement of the special record (TU) required within Transmitted files. Most “real world” submissions will contain more data and more record types. The examples do not show the non-display **HEX characters 0D0A that must be at the end of every record**, including the record group terminator records (the “[“ for Summary and the “]” for Incident-Based). Failure to include the HEX 0D0A at the end of every record will result in file length errors.

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3.8.1 SUMMARY TRANSMITTED FILE EXAMPLE

This example is for an Transmitted file of Summary data for a jurisdiction. These records are in a file named 4640502.UCR. The first record is the TU record which associates the file with authorized system user 'UCR4640501'.

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3.8.2 SUMMARY AUTHORIZED JURISDICTION TRANSMITTED FILE EXAMPLE

This example is for an Transmitted Authorized Jurisdiction file of Summary data for jurisdictions 46405 and 23111 submitted by jurisdiction 46405. These records are in a file named for jurisdiction 46405 (e.g. 4640502.MCR). The first two records (the A0 record and the “[“ record) are related to jurisdiction 23111. The rest of the records are related to jurisdiction 46405. When this file is successfully processed, two files named 2311102.UCR and 4640502.UCR will be split out and processed. The first record is the TU record which associates the file with authorized system user ‘UCR4640501’.

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3.8.4 INCIDENT-BASED AUTHORIZED JURISDICTION TRANSMITTED FILE EXAMPLE

This example is for an Transmitted Authorized Jurisdiction file of Incident-based data for jurisdictions 01203 and 01001 submitted by jurisdiction 01203. These records are in a file named 0120362I.UCR. These records would be in a file named for jurisdiction 01203 (e.g. 0120362I.MCR). The first group of records (records 2 through 8) is related to jurisdiction 01203. The next group of records (records 10 through 21) is related to jurisdiction 01001. Notice that a record group terminator record (i.e. “]]”) is not to follow the TU or CB records. When this file is successfully processed, two files named 0120301I.UCR and 0100101I.UCR will be split out and processed. The first record is the TU record which associates the file with authorized system user ‘UCR0120301’.

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4 RESULTS FILES FOR TRANSMITTED FILES

4.1 RESULTS FILES NAMING CONVENTION

Results file names are derived from the Extended file name of the Transmitted file by replacing the file extension “UCR” with “RCR”.

Examples:

A file named **05G0201I.UCR** Transmitted by a user with UserId **ucr05g0201** on **September 2, 2002** at **12:39:19** would have an Extended file name of **ucr05g0201@2002-09-02@123919@05G0201I.ucr** and a Results file name of **ucr05g0201@2002-09-02@123919@05G0201I.rcr**

A file named **0243308.UCR** Transmitted by a user with UserId **ronsum** (less than 10 characters so UserId padded with spaces) on **October 12, 2002** at **12:40:03** would have an Extended file name of **ronsum @2002-10-12@124003@0243308.ucr** and a Results file name of **ronsum @2002-10-12@124003@0243308.rcr**

See “Summary Files Upload Specification” and “PA IBR File Upload Specifications” for more information on upload and extended filenames.
